## Welcome

If you are visiting our church today, we welcome you to our worship service and Christian community. The Lord's Supper is observed every Sunday as the climax of covenant renewal worship. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and wine with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to the elders of this local church that you are in covenant with God as an active member of a congregation in which the Gospel is faithfully confessed, taught, and believed. If you have any doubt about your participation, please speak to one of the elders or the pastor before or after the service. Note: The middle circle of cups in each tray contains grape juice, the larger outer ring contains wine (the grape juice has a darker color than the wine).

## The Simple Cross (Front Cover)



During Lent this year we will display a simple, unadorned cross on the front cover of our bulletins. This will remind us of God the Son's climactic act of service for humanity. He allowed his arms to be stretched out on the cross bar, and his feet were nailed to the tree. Thus he voluntarily gave himself up to death for the sins of his people. Paul tells us that the Gospel is "the message of the cross. . . to us who are being saved is the power of God"(1 Cor. 1:18).

## A Simple Church Year Catechism

Q. 21. How should we pray during Lent?
A. During Lent we confess our sins and ask God to help us change our ways.

Q 22. Why does the church call this season "Lent"?
A. Lent is an old English name for Springtime.

Q 23. Why does the season of Lent last 40 days?
A. Because in the Bible God often tests people for 40 days or years and gives them a chance to repent and change.
Q 24. What are two important examples of this time of testing in the Bible?
A. Israel was tested for 40 years in the wilderness before they entered the Promised Land and Jesus was tested for 40 days in the desert.

Q 25. Why does God test us?
A. God tests our faith to make us steadfast and mature Christians (James 1:2-4).
