Welcome

If you are **visiting** our church today, we welcome you to our worship service and Christian community. Please find the registration book in the foyer of the church and help us serve you better by leaving your name and contact information. We promise to keep this information confidential and only use it for personal contact with you and your family. Join us downstairs for coffee after this morning's service.

All Sunday School classes are suspended for the summer months. You are invited to stay after the service for a bit and enjoy coffee and conversation down in the Fellowship Hall. There will be no evening service tonight.

If you are unfamiliar with **our form of worship**, please feel free to speak with one of the Pastors or Elders. The **Lord's Supper** is observed every Sunday as the climax of covenant renewal worship. We invite to the Lord's Table all those who are baptized disciples of Jesus Christ, under the authority of Christ and his body, the Church. By eating the bread and wine with us as a visitor, you are acknowledging to the elders of this local church that you are in covenant with God as an active member of a congregation in which the Gospel is faithfully confessed, taught, and believed. If you have any doubt about your participation, please speak to one of the elders or the pastor before or after the service. **Note:** The middle circle of cups in each tray contains grape juice, the larger outer ring contains wine (the grape juice has a darker color than the wine).

The Tree of Life (Front Cover)



In the Bible, trees are given to man for food and medicine as well as beauty and shade. Trees are an emblem of God's glory in the world and so are fitting symbols of God's people. We can flourish "like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither" (Psalm 1:3). The growth of the kingdom is likened to a rising, spreading tree (Ezek. 17; Matt. 13:31-32). Adam's fall severed us from access to the Tree of Life, but united to Christ we again have access to its life-giving fruit (Rev. 22:2).

This is Trinity Season and so the color of the Table cloth and pulpit scarf is **green**, symbolizing life, growth, and the maturation of Jesus kingdom.



The Lord's Service Explained

The Absolution

After kneeling to confess our sins we rise to hear the declaration of forgiveness, often called "the absolution." To be absolved from the guilt of our sins is a formal, ministerial declaration of God's forgiveness. This gracious declaration of God is proclaimed by the minister, usually with a simple traditional formula of absolution or a short portion of God's Word that announces God's grace to those that confess their sins and trust in Jesus.

The intent of the absolution at the beginning of the Christian liturgy is to communicate very simply and powerfully to the gathered church that God in Christ forgives us and now receives us into his glorious presence. Forgiveness is announced by the Pastor who has been ordained by God to represent Christ to the people during the worship service. John Calvin applies John 20:19-23 to the ordinary office of the ministry:

We now see the reason why Christ employs such magnificent terms, to commend and adorn that ministry which he bestows and enjoins on the Apostles. It is, that believers may be fully convinced, that what they hear concerning the forgiveness of sins is ratified, and may not less highly value the reconciliation which is offered by the voice of men, than if God himself stretched out his hand from heaven. And the church daily receives the most abundant benefit from this teaching, when it perceives that her pastors are divinely ordained to be sureties for eternal salvation, and that it must not go to a distance to seek the forgiveness of sins, which is committed to their trust.

Therefore, the word of forgiveness from the Pastor is a gift to the congregation so that they don't have "go to a distance to seek the forgiveness of sins."

The absolution is not a mini-sermon. It doesn't contain "illustrations" or quotations from famous Christians. This is not the place for the Pastor to tell stories or create rhetorically artful phrases in order to adorn the declaration and "make it stick." Why not? Because the absolution is designed to be heard by the congregation as the voice of their heavenly Father. It is not about some interesting or compelling personal story told by the Pastor or some cool quotation from a clever Christian author or theologian. We leave the voice of Augustine or John Calvin or C.S. Lewis out of it. The Pastor is not speaking on the authority of some Christian expert; neither is he speaking on his own authority. He should not be propping up God's declaration of forgiveness with either the authority of famous Christians or of a heart-warming story. If any of that is appropriate in Christian worship, it belongs in the sermon.

The Pastor simply and powerfully proclaims the forgiveness of sins and each member of the congregation is thereby challenged to *believe* that this is God's word of assurance to them personally. Feeling forgiven or sensing it in some mystical way *may* happen during the absolution, but it is not to be expected. By *faith* we trust we are forgiven by God even, maybe especially when we have no immediate sense or feeling that it is so. This is what true faith is all about.
